Communities of Practice

Teachers who enroll in our Boot Camp and Spotlight classes (which focus on teaching specific age groups) are invited to participate in dynamic online Communities of Practice with colleagues doing the same work. Professional Assessment Tool

The NEXT Professional Assessment Tool for Supplementary School Teachers (PAT) is an opportunity for teachers to think comprehensively about how their teaching reflects current best practices in multiple dimensions. Specifically designed with Jewish supplementary school teachers in mind, it takes about 30 minutes to complete. The PAT can be utilized in multiple ways as teachers automatically receive copies of their answers. In addition to general assessment, we have now added a Hebrew & Prayer assessment tool. As Education Directors, you are invited to peruse the tool and may choose to use either or both of them as part of your year-end teacher evaluation.

FEES

Through the generosity of the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia, NEXT programs are free to all teachers in the Philadelphia area. The Communities of Practice and Professional Assessment Tools are free to everyone.

Our online classes are open to teachers outside the Philadelphia area for \$75 per three-week class, \$100 per four-week class, \$150 per six-week class, \$200 per eight-week class. The fee for Jewish Essentials for Teachers and for the Boot Camp for New Teachers, which are self-paced and have rolling admission, is \$150.

We encourage education directors to contact NEXT to arrange group discounts. If you enroll three teachers, you can enroll a fourth teacher at no charge.

Teachers in Baltimore, Cleveland, Detroit, Hartford, Houston, Miami, Milwaukee and the Greater Palm Beaches can now also register for NEXT online classes at special tuition rates through the generosity of their central agencies and federations.
